Avoiding Plagiarism

What is plagiarism?

From a Latin word for "kidnapper," **plagiarism** is the presentation of someone else's **words or ideas** as your own. It often occurs in student papers, sometimes through intentional cheating, but more often through the simple lack of knowledge of the rules of proper documentation of research materials.

- Plagiarism is a **form of theft**—of ideas and words rather than of physical possessions.
- Whether deliberate or accidental, plagiarism is taken very seriously by the academic world.
- Plagiarism is often a punishable offense.

Central Catholic High School Statement on Plagiarism

Plagiarism occurs when a student attempts to present as his own what has come from another source; for example, using ideas of another person, paraphrased or not, without giving credit to that source; rewriting borrowed material through minor word or sentence adjustments; presenting as one's own a paper, project, or assignment that has been partially or completely prepared by another person, whether a relative, friend, fellow student, alumnus, or an employee of an online service or other business that produces such work, and so on (Academic Integrity Committee).
