Juniors in the Honors class must also read two additional required novels (*Walking the Rez* by Jim Northrup and *The Death of Jim Loney* by James Welch) for a total of five novels.
- 3. Due date for Double Entry Journals is Friday, August 30, 2019 by 11:59 PM on Turnitin; no late assignments will be accepted.
 - This assignment will be turned into your 2019-2020 English Teacher.
 - The Double Entry Journals will be worth 25% of an essay grade in your Junior English course.
