DEAR ALUMNI AND FRIENDS OF CENTRAL CATHOLIC,

"Together and by Association" we faced, overcame, and grew from the many challenges of last school year. Not surprisingly, there were also moments of grace and insight that sprang up when you would least expect it. One of those graces was the time to reflect and take stock of the "why" of Central Catholic. Why do so many of our alumni and students say this is a special place? Why do so many of our alumni become successful leaders in their communities? Why does "Live Jesus in our hearts ... Forever" still inspire and motivate?

One day during the summer I asked our assistant principal, a 2003 graduate, for his thoughts about what makes our Central Catholic community so special. He summed Central up in three words which he admitted are borrowed from other Catholic thinkers, but he emphasized that the order is most important.

RELATIONSHIP - IDENTITY - MISSION

From the first day of freshman year, when boys from over 50 school districts enter these doors for the first time as a class, we begin the slow and gradual process of developing deep and meaningful **RELATIONSHIPS**. We want them to feel welcome, to feel connected, to see that we care about them, so they can care about others and begin building relationships among themselves. We want them to recognize that in this community, they can form bonds that last a lifetime and draw strength and confidence from those bonds.

As these relationships grow, students like what they see and begin to develop their **IDENTITY**, seeing themselves as Central Catholic young men who want to be Men of Faith, Scholarship and Service.

At graduation, they take that Brotherhood with them as they go out on **MISSION** knowing that the relationships they have made will support and sustain them. Our current students were able to witness this firsthand when one of our young alumni, Cal Adomitis, '17, spoke with the student body on All Saints Day about how his four years at Central formed him and gave him the strength to go out into the world to serve others. Each week we send several freshmen to the "Red Door" in downtown Pittsburgh to help prepare and serve lunch to underserved populations. For almost 90 years, men and women have been coming to the landmark "Red Door" located in the heart of downtown Pittsburgh. This lunch program was started by St. Mary of Mercy Church in response to the Great Depression in an effort to relieve those struggling with financial adversity.





JUNIOR INSPIRES FBLA AS NATIONAL EASTERN REGION VP

Region VP. As Eastern Region VP, Jack represents 13 states

Jack and Mrs. Maxwell travelled to Kalahari Resorts and Conventions in the Pocono Mountains, to attend the State Leadership Workshop. The Workshop is three days of action-packed leadership training where over 600 FBLA students from across the state converged to listen to amazing speakers, complete leadership development, and, of course, have a lot of fun along the way. Jack was a guest speaker and presented to all 600 students.



STUDENTS SCORE THOUSANDS OF DOLLARS IN FINANCIAL AID OFFERS FROM HISTORICALLY BLACK COLLEGES AND UNIVERSITIES

After an uncertain 2020-21 school year, we are grateful to have our Vikings back in-person for five days a week of in-person instruction. We welcomed 756 men of Faith, Scholarship and Service back for their official first day of classes on Aug. 27, 2021.

The Frick Environmental Center is a certified Living Building that has achieved Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design (LEED) Platinum. During the tour, the students learned about the seven living building petals that make the center a living building: equity, water, site, health, beauty, materials and energy. 
CENTRAL WELCOMES BACK THERAPY DOG COLT







Become That Someone




On Tuesday, Oct. 12, 2021, Central Catholic had the pleasure of hosting Jay Twyman, son of Jack Twyman, '51, for a school-wide assembly where he discussed the life and legacy of his father.

After viewing a short ESPN documentary on Jack Twyman, Mike Clark, WTAE evening anchor, led the discussion with Jay, where he discussed what is often referred to as "the ultimate friendship" between his father and injured teammate Maurice Stokes. Jack acted as Maurice's caretaker, raised hundreds of thousands of dollars for his medical bills and fought for NBA insurance and worker's compensation reform. This incredible story served as the cover story in the Winter/Spring 2021 issue of *The Quadrangle* magazine.

By sharing this story with our current students, it is our hope that we can continue to instill the values of faith, scholarship and service that Jack portrayed during his life and inspire our students to "become that someone," just as Jack did for Maurice.

At the end of the assembly, Jay presented Central Catholic with a Twyman-Stokes award, which is given annually to the best teammate in the NBA.

UP TO \$6,000 FOR 4 YEARS

The Jack Twyman Leadership Scholarship will be awarded to students who have demonstrated the potential to be leaders in



their communities. This can range from the student's classroom performance to their extracurricular activities to their local and faith communities. Central Catholic aims to provide these opportunities for all our students but would like to reward those who come to us having demonstrated these skills. In addition to completing the Application for Admission and taking the Placement Test, students will be asked to complete a scholarship application and submit an additional essay and letter of recommendation.

Congratulations to the varsity soccer team for advancing to the first-round of playoffs and a second-place finish in their section.




FOOTBALL ENDS SEASON AS WPIAL 6A RUNNER-UP



LEADS THROUGH SERVICE, SMASHING CHILDREN'S HOSPITAL OF PITTSBURGH **FUNDRAISING GOAL**



When the U.S. Supreme Court ruled that NCAA college athletes are allowed to use their name, image and likeness (NIL) in July 2021, for many college athletes, that meant the opportunity to earn money through their own brand.

For Cal Adomitis, '17, team captain and long-snapper on the University of Pittsburgh football team, that meant something bigger – using his likeness, and his iconic long hair, to set a lofty fundraising goal of raising \$94,000 for the UPMC Children's Hospital of Pittsburgh Foundation to help kids who are battling cancer. Dubbed "Cal's Kids," Cal launched his campaign on Oct. 7, 2021.

When that goal was reached, he promised to shave his head to show his support for children battling cancer, by doing what so many kids have done while undergoing treatment, cutting their hair.



One of the things that I have thought about during my journey at PITT is the belief that my coaches, family and friends have had in me through the years and how influential that has been," said Cal. "[Their belief] has played a huge part in me having the success I have had so far. So, with that gratitude in mind, I thought that it was crucial to utilize the new NIL framework to make good use of the platform that we are blessed with as athletes and try to give back.

When asked why he chose UPMC Children's Hospital of Pittsburgh, Cal said that it was the "perfect place" to make an impact and that he strongly believes that "every kid deserves a chance to chase their dreams." Each year, UPMC Children's Hospital of Pittsburgh treats more than 1,000 cancer patients. Cal met his goal of \$94,000 in a little over a month on Nov. 17, 2021. At the time of publication, Cal had raised \$112,595 for the cause.

In addition to his fundraising success, he has also racked up several honors during the course of the 2021 football season, including being named the 2021 Patrick Mannelly Award winner, being selected for the All State "Good Works" team, and being named an All-ACC Honorable mention.

In early November, Cal stopped by Central Catholic to briefly discuss his journey from Central Catholic to where he is now. Central Catholic also presented Cal with a check of \$1,094 to support Cal's Kids, in honor of his University of Pittsburgh jersey number, 94.





Remembering Brother Benedict Oliver, FSC, '55

APRIL 16, 1937 - MAY 21, 2021

Brother Benedict Oliver, FSC, was called home to the Lord on August 11, 2021.

Born John Herbert Oliver Jr., Brother Benedict grew up in West Philadelphia, the oldest of four boys. He first became familiar with the De La Salle Christian Brothers as a student at West Catholic Preparatory High School, and the care they showed for their students and love of teaching inspired him to pursue the vocation, entering the novitiate in June 1956.

Brother Benedict earned a bachelor's degree in English and a master's degree in theology from La Salle University, along with a graduate degree in educational leadership from Duquesne University.

In his early years as a Christian Brother, Brother Benedict taught English, inspiring English students at Central Catholic from 1961 until 1977, when he became principal.

Brother Benedict served as principal at Central Catholic until 1979, later returning from 1991 – 1994, again from 2003 – 2005 and once more in 2009, when he started a writing center for students and worked until his retirement in 2017.

Brother Benedict is remembered fondly by the many students he taught through the English department and in his time as the Masque moderator.


