- Are you able to work at a minimum 3.5 GPA level?
- Will you committ to 3 years of foreign language study?
- Do you have innovative abilities, intellectual curiosity and interest in social causes?

- Include your best writing sample
- Provide 2 teacher recommendations
- · Write a short answer to an assigned prompt
- Submit a copy of your transcript

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JUNIOR SEMINAR

Junior seminar explores some of the most enduring philosophical, ethical, and social questions of humanity through a variety of ancient and contemporary texts. CULTURAL TRAVEL

All students in Scholars Program take part in one trip per year to a major city in the USA. In recent years, we have visited Boston, New York, Washington DC, Cleveland, Philadelphia, and Chicago. We meet with university professors in a classroom setting and enter into dialogue on critical issues in their field. The trips will teach you how to see a city through cultural exploration and the arts too.



SCHOLARS FORUM

Senior Thesis marks the culmination of a student's experience in the Scholars Program. Under the guidance of the Senior Director and a second reader, you will articulate a developed, ethical argument in response to a motivating question or issue. The end goal is to make an independent contribution to human knowledge. You can transform yourself and the world by providing new solutions to big problems!



STUDY ABROAD

Studying abroad at the high school level is a unique opportunity. Not only does it anticipate possibilities available at the university level, it also exposes you to a diversity of culture and the excitement of international travel. The academic preparation in the months before the trip will teach you to view travel as more than a touristic venture, and to view it as transformational to the human spirit.

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
