

A VISIT TO NORMANDY

Each Summer, the Albert H. Small Normandy Institute takes fifteen student-teacher teams from across the United States on the learning experience of a lifetime. Mr. Gregory Thomas, '05 and Xander Hill, '23 were chosen to represent Pittsburgh, PA. The Institute is an intensive program designed to educate participants about the D-Day Campaign of 1944 and the sacrifices made by young Americans to defeat tyranny. Members of the Institute began studying World War II and the Normandy Campaign in January with a curriculum of assigned readings. They participated in weekly online discussions supervised by Institute staff from The George Washington University. From late June to early July 2022, Institute participants travel to the campus of The George Washington University in Washington, D.C., for a series of lectures and activities to deepen their understanding of elements of the conflict. Finally, the students and teachers traveled to France and participated in a week-long tour of

the many sites that played a role in the Normandy Campaign. Each student delivers a presentation on a briefing topic of their choice concerning some element of the campaign at the appropriate site.



Xander's topic was the B-17 Flying Fortress and its role in the strategic bombing campaign. And as a capstone to the Institute, each team selects a member of the United States Armed Forces from their hometown who participated in the Normandy Campaign and gave his or her life in the effort to liberate France, prepares a biography of that service member, and then delivers their eulogy while standing by his or her graveside in the Normandy American Cemetery at Colleville-Sur-Mer. Xander eulogized 1st Lieutenant John Joseph Henderson.

AUXILIARY BISH P VISITS CENTRAL

The mass was a historic moment that will be cherished for many years to come by Auxiliary Bishop Eckman and the Central Catholic family.

Students, faculty, staff, alumni, and special guests gathered in Central Catholic's McGonigle Theater for the first mass of the 2022-23 school year. On hand was Bishop Mark Eckman, Auxiliary Bishop of the Diocese of Pittsburgh, who visited Central (for the first time in his life) and facilitated mass. He complimented the school, its tradition, and the legacy of how the Christian Brothers-led institution has a rich history of instilling sound knowledge and upholds the essence of Lasallian teachings that has been poured into pupils over the past 95 years. His homily was received well by all in attendance. Catering his message towards Central Catholic's unique architecture and history of providing students with a robust Lasallian education, Auxiliary Bishop Eckman was adamant about mentioning how he, too, was educated by Christian Brothers. He attended South Hills Catholic (now Seton LaSalle) in the 1970s and applauded Central for continuing the tradition.

"THE LASALLIAN VALUE SYSTEM WAS ALWAYS PREVALENT IN MY LIFE AND IT IS GOOD TO SEE THAT CONTINUE HERE AT CENTRAL," Auxiliary Bishop Eckman said. "CHRISTIAN BROTHERS LIVE THEIR VOCATION OUT DAILY AND IT IS GRATIFYING TO KNOW THAT IT CONTINUES TO THIS DAY."

ed by team captain Rocco Salvitti, '23, the Vikings worked as a cohesive unit and had a strong showing all season. Salvitti, a four-year standout for the team, became part of a legacy of golfers from Central Catholic who have been a continuous force in the Western Pennsylvania Interscholastic Athletic League (WPIAL) over the past 20 years. Salvitti's individual wins came during the WPIAL tournaments throughout his high school career, placing him in the top 10 from his freshman to junior year.

As a senior, he won the gold by shooting a 2-under 139 in the 36-hole event, staking his claim as the best golfer in the district. The tournament, which took place at Allegheny Country Club, had two other Vikings place in the top 10 - Connor Walker, '23 (3rd) and Aidan Burchianti, '23 (7th).



"This year, just like previous years, has been a great group of guys that have played for Central," Salvitti said. "Our drive to win has been so strong that we were determined to be great. But we knew that we wanted more."

Striving to be great on the state level was next on the agenda for Central Catholic. Salvitti made it to the PIAA finals as an individual. However, he fell a bit short in the PIAA championship by a few strokes and finished in second place with a score of 3-under 141. Having a team-first mentality, he avoided dejection from defeat and said: "This motivated my teammates and me to reach the ultimate goal in Pennsylvania. Together!"

With an abundance of confidence, coupled with humility, the Vikings went to Penn State University and took to the White Course in an effort to compete for Pennsylvania's highest prize. "We were all super excited to compete," Salvitti said, as they prepared to put a game plan together to go up against the state's most powerful teams. Leading into the tournament, Salvitti said to the team, "If everybody does their job and plays within their own game, we're going to win by a large amount."

And that's exactly what they did.

As a band of brothers, the team was able to achieve greatness with their foursome of Salvitti, Burchianti, Daniel Donahue, '23, and Connor Walker, '23. Collectively, they shot an 11-over 299, a six-shot triumph to win the Boys 3A Championship over Dallastown Area High School (York, Pa.). The Vikings brought home the gold which qualifies them to play in the national tournament in the summer of 2023!

O'CONNOR ECHOED THOSE SENTIMENTS:

"It was truly an emotional win for us. We didn't know what the road had in store for us, but we were able to persevere."

JUST WEEKS FOLLOWING THE PIAA CHAMPIONSHIP, O'CONNOR ANNOUNCED HIS RETIREMENT FROM COACHING.

"It was an incredible experience. I was so excited when I got the job. Something that I've always cherished was being the coach at Central Catholic High School. The experience I had with the students as an assistant and as head coach has been great, and going out on top is even sweeter. I have also had great role models in my life as well."

O'Connor, a former member of the Vikings Golf Team as a student, began his coaching career at Central as an assistant shortly after graduation. During that time, he built a game plan that would eventually lead to an abundance of wins.

The torch was passed from former head coach Michael McGrath, '67, who led the Vikings from 2001-2006.

O'Connor says he is truly grateful for the opportunity bestowed upon him. "Mr. McGrath was a great role model for me, and before giving me the job, he told me, 'Hey, here's the new model. This is how we're going to win at Central. And then I think getting there (the championship) every year is one thing, that's the kids' short-term goal. But I'm entrusting you to bring it home for us!""

O'Connor's record as head coach was nothing short of impressive.

"It was just awesome! This is something that we will never forget! All of our teammates, all of the families that were there to support us, and everybody from the school that was there, by our side. It's just the little things that you'll never forget, and to be able to get our rings, come back to the school for reunions and be a part of Central's history is simply amazing!"

MATTHEW CLARK, '12 WAS AN OUTSTANDING STUDENT AT CENTRAL.

He was a soccer player and a mission-driven young man who put others before himself. Clark participated in various mission trips to the Blackfeet Indian Reservation in Montana and Nicaragua. Most importantly, he was a son and a brother with an unconditional love of family. Clark's life was tragically cut short in 2019. Thanks in part to this special fund, he will forever be a part of the Central Catholic legacy.



Son to Mike and Terri Clark, and brother to Michael, Danielle, and Anthony, Matthew made a lasting and overwhelmingly positive impression on others. Mike Clark, evening news anchor for WTAE-TV (4), is a respected and

well-known person in Pittsburgh. As a result, after Matthew's passing, support from the Central Catholic community and beyond was profound and immediate

An incredible gesture was extended by Chairmen of the 2022 Viking Victory Auction, "The Kelly Brothers" (Mike, '78, Mark, '80, Brian, '83, and Robert, P '11), who honored Matthew at the annual event. That evening, the "Fund the Mission" fundraising campaign was dedicated to establishing the Fund. In mere minutes, attendees contributed over \$50,000. The Fund was off to an inspirational start!

Following the Auction, Mike was at a loss for words. While in the emotionfilled room, he witnessed the Central Catholic community at work. Clark said of his son, "MATTHEW WAS ALL ABOUT LOOKING OUT FOR OTHER PEOPLE. HE DIDN'T WANT THE SPOTLIGHT ON HIMSELF. HE WAS VERY FUNNY AND ALWAYS MADE HIS FRIENDS LAUGH." Overjoyed by the swift and abundantly extensive level of support, Clark said, "OUR FAMILY CANNOT THANK CENTRAL ENOUGH FOR SHEPHERDING THIS AND MAKING IT A REALITY. I KNOW WHAT IT'S GOING TO MEAN FOR THESE FAMILIES."

Once the Fund was established, close friends of the Clark family implemented a robust and highly effective action plan to do their part to add to the endowment fund. Joe Belechak and Jeff Wlahofsky led the charge. Joe said, "MIKE AND I HAD A COFFEE ONE MORNING, AND I ASKED, 'WHAT WOULD IT TAKE?' MORE IMPORTANTLY, 'WHAT CAN I DO TO HELP?'"

MY THREE SONS AND MIKE'S SONS ARE THE SAME AGE, WE'VE COACHED THEM UP THROUGH FOREST HILLS/ CHURCHILL BASEBALL AND THE ST. MAURICE SOCCER YEARS TO WHEN THEY WERE AT CENTRAL CATHOLIC. I KNOW THE BOYS VERY WELL, AND I KNOW THE CLARK FAMILY VERY WELL. PEOPLE WANT TO GIVE BACK, ESPECIALLY CENTRAL GRADUATES, TO THE COMMUNITY THAT RAISED THEM INTO WHO THEY ARE. WHEN I HEAR ABOUT MATTHEW AND WHAT HE DID IN HIS SHORT LIFE, IT IS AN EVEN BIGGER REASON TO CONTRIBUTE TO THE ENDOWMENT FUND."



The Clarks have been longtime family friends with Joe's family. This friendship, along with their shared Christian values, helped to galvanize the spirit behind this effort. "IT IS IMPORTANT TO HAVE PEOPLE EDUCATED AT A PLACE LIKE CENTRAL CATHOLIC. THOSE WHO HAVE FAITH-BASED BELIEFS AND VALUES WANT TO HELP OTHER PEOPLE." Belechak said. "IT GOES BEYOND THE CLASSROOM AND SHOWS THAT THIS COMMUNITY IS SPECIAL, AND PEOPLE WANT TO REACH OUT AND HELP OTHERS." An important piece to note is how the fundraising is being received outside of the Central community. "PEOPLE WITH NO AFFILIATION WITH CENTRAL ARE CONTRIBUTING. TO ME, THAT'S BEEN THE MOST OVERWHELMING, IMPRESSIVE THING I'VE SEEN SO FAR," said Belechak.

The Central Catholic community – in addition to a tremendous outpouring of support from the public at large – have extended the hand of generosity.

I CAN'T FULLY DESCRIBE THE FEELING I HAVE TO SEE PEOPLE GIVE SO LOVINGLY," SAID CLARK. "IT'S SOMETHING I NEVER THOUGHT I'D SEE, AND MY FAMILY IS TRULY GRATEFUL."
