Over three centuries ago, Saint John Baptist de La Salle, inspired with a new vision of what a school could be, founded a religious order dedicated to teaching, that saw education as much more than just the transmission of information and skills. The school years were seen as an important and essential time in the life of boys as they grew into young men. The order he founded would become known as the Brothers of the Christian Schools.

Since 1927, Central Catholic has continued in this time-tested tradition of educating boys through a spirit of accompaniment, the unique Lasallian approach to education.

We meet your young teenager where he is, and journey with him as he discovers his God-given gifts and potential with a personalized and student-centered experience. 



Engineering Institute at Central Catholic

The goal of the Engineering Institute at Central Catholic (EICC) is to provide students opportunities, through a combination of coursework, resources, and outside-of-the-classroom experiences, to answer questions and allow them to make informed decisions about pursuing an engineering career.

EICC students will be engaged in an intellectually challenging, hands-on, and relevant curriculum with coursework and experiences designed to foster creativity, problem-solving, teamwork, and communication, providing them with exposure to engineering careers and preparing them for entry into a college engineering

Students accepted into the EICC will be part of a cohort that will complete the curricular requirements of the three-year program. The focus of the senior year engineering class will be the completion of a capstone design project.

Along with the EICC coursework, students will be involved in outside-of-the-classroom experiences that include quest speakers, seminars, field trips, and collaboration with a professional mentor.

Each year, Central Catholic High School inducts a small number of outstanding sophomores into the Brother David S. Baginski, FSC Scholars Program. This is a highly selective two-year program for juniors and seniors of exceptional merit and potential.

Established in 2002, the program is designed to enhance and enrich the academic and cultural experiences of talented and highly motivated students. The program can supplement academic interests in the humanities, social sciences and applied science.

All students in the Scholars Program take part in one trip per year to a major city in the United States. In recent years, we have visited Boston, New York, Washington DC, Cleveland, Philadelphia, and Chicago. We meet with university professors in a classroom setting and enter into dialogue on critical issues in their field. The trips will teach you how to see a city through cultural exploration and the arts.

The Senior Thesis marks the culmination of a student's experience in the Scholars Program. Under the guidance of the Senior Director and a second reader, you will articulate a developed, ethical argument in response to a motivating question or issue.

The end goal is to make an independent contribution to human knowledge. You can transform yourself and the world by providing new solutions to big problems!

The Bishop McDowell Program

Designed to facilitate student success through the development and reinforcement of necessary skills, the Bishop McDowell Program encourages students, through a variety of individually designed activities, to become thoroughly familiar with their own learning styles.

Students in the Bishop McDowell Program attend regular classes and participate fully in the co-curricular life of the school, but have scheduled time for assistance and skill-building to enable them to progress in the college preparatory curriculum.

When students understand how they learn best, they can then begin to apply strategies that work for them in the classroom, while completing homework, and when preparing for exams. Concurrently, the director and assistant director of the Bishop McDowell Program work with the Central Catholic faculty to help them understand each student's learning style and the related implications for classroom practices.







The Value of a Central Catholic Education

Financial aid

A Central Catholic education and all of the opportunities that come with it is a significant financial investment for many families, but it is also a significant investment in your son's future. We believe that Central Catholic is the premier high school in Western Pennsylvania for boys, but it is also the best dollar for dollar value in the Pittsburgh area's private education market.

Central Catholic High School is committed to keeping our program affordable and accessible to all who desire a faith- based, college-preparatory education. Therefore, financial aid is available for qualified families. Financial aid packages could include funds from a variety of sources including the Central Catholic Fund, the Bishop's Education Fund, the Opportunity Scholarship Tax Credit (OSTC) and the Earned Income Tax Credit (EITC) programs.

Central Catholic High School, historically, has been able to meet approximately 70% of a family's calculated need.

For the 2024-25 school year, more than \$3.2 million was awarded to 350 families.

The Financial Aid Processd

Families are asked to complete the FACTS Grant & Aid Application, which is available online in January. Your income tax documents will be required for completion of the FACTS Grant & Aid Application. The deadline for completion is March 15. Late applications will be accepted until the funds have been diminished. Financial aid awards will be announced in May.

If, after receiving an initial financial award, a family feels that their situation has changed or that certain extenuating circumstances were not accounted for in the FACTS Application, an appeal may be made in writing to the Central Catholic Financial Aid office.
